Biden taps longtime diplomat jettisoned under Trump as US ambassador to the UN



Linda Thomas-Greenfield grew up in Louisiana, “in a segregated town in which the KKK regularly would come on weekends and burn a cross in somebody’s yard,” she recounted in a TED Talk in 2018. Neither of her parents graduated high school.

Attending Louisiana State University in the early 1970s, she encountered a “hostile environment” where she faced harassment and racism.

She was forced out at the outset of the Trump administration after a decades-long career at the State Department.

Now Thomas-Greenfield is poised to take on one of her country’s most senior diplomatic jobs as President-elect Joe Biden’s pick to be US ambassador to the United Nations.

“In the years that I’ve worked in government, I’m always struck by how only in America we’d be where we are today. Where life can be hard and cruel but there’s hope in the struggle,” Thomas-Greenfield said on Tuesday after being introduced by Biden at an event in Wilmington, Delaware.

Current and former US foreign service officers praised Thomas-Greenfield as an ideal candidate to restore the standing of the US and rebuild credibility at the venerable multilateral institution. The Trump administration has severed ties with a number of key UN agencies over the past four years -- cutting funding to and starting the process of withdrawing from the World Health Organization, for example, and leaving the Human Rights Council -- and frequently lambasted the organization. The foreign service officers who spoke with CNN hailed the choice of a career diplomat for the role. And given the State

Department’s reputation for being “pale, male and Yale,” particularly among its leadership, several people said Biden’s choice of a Black woman for the job sends an important message.

“Just having a Black woman heading the transition and likely heading the US mission in New York is a big deal,” one senior diplomat told CNN. “And to have it be a Black woman who was fired by Trump, that’s even more of a statement.”

He also noted that “she clearly has the confidence” of the Biden team, as she is also serving as the head of their State Department Agency Review Team during the transition. She was in contact with the State Department transition team on Monday evening following the General Services Administration’s decision that Biden could begin the transition process, according to

a senior State Department official with knowledge of the transition.

Many see Thomas-Greenfield’s candidacy for the UN ambassador job, along with that of Antony Blinken for secretary of state, as a move to return to a more traditional foreign policy approach. In her remarks Tuesday, she declared that “America is back, multilateralism is back, diplomacy is back.”

“The challenges we face -- a global pandemic, the global economy, the global climate crisis, mass migration and extreme poverty, social justice -- are unrelenting and interconnected,” Thomas-Greenfield said. “But they’re not unsolvable if America is leading the way.”

She also reflected on her parents, who she said gave her and her siblings “everything they had.” “I know how proud they would be of this day,” she said.

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As 4,311 more coronavirus cases are reported, L.A. County officials get earful on restaurant closures



On the eve of a ban on outdoor dining, the outcry from business owners and their advocates continued to grow throughout Los Angeles County where officials are taking steps beyond state guidelines as new coronavirus cases were skyrocketing at rates not yet seen. Daily statistics propelled by the surge, meanwhile, showed no sign of relenting. County public health officials posted another 49 coronavirus-related deaths on Wednesday, Nov. 25, and another 4,311 cases, while 1,682 people are hospitalized. The county now has a cumulative total of 7,543 deaths due to the virus, and 378,323 cases since the pandemic began.

Outdoor dining was set to end for at least three weeks everywhere but Pasadena in L.A. County beginning 10 p.m. Wednesday under a revised health officer order affirmed by the Board of Supervisors in a 3-2 vote the day before. The order will still allow takeout and delivery, but business was expected to be drastically reduced with hundreds of thousands of jobs affected.

At the steps of The Abbey Food & Bar in West Hollywood, owner David Cooley held back tears at the thought of his nearly 30-year-old restaurant — a place he calls home — not being able to survive the latest shutdown for in-person dining.

“As the state and county constantly changed the rules and regulations, we adopted to every one of them,” said Cooley, who described the effort the restaurant went through to create outdoor seating and safe protocols. “Now all of that investment is wasted with forced closures.”

Cooley joined fellow restaurant owners and their employees along with business leaders Wednesday with the California Coalition for Safe Reopening to call on the county to seek alternatives and sustainable solutions for restaurants so that they can remain open during the pandemic. Colin Diaz, President of the Culver City Chamber of Commerce, la-

mented the jobs that will likely be lost — some permanently — under the next round of closures. Under similar rules earlier in the pandemic, the Los Angeles Economic Development Council estimated 700,000 jobs were potentially affected among food service workers.

“Another Safer at Home order with similar restrictions placed on business operations will further exacerbate this crisis and close some business for good,” Diaz said. “By closing safe outdoor venues that follow all the regulations the county is creating more unsafe practices for people to gathering in their homes where transmission are more likely to take place.”

Genevieve Morrill, President of the West Hollywood Chamber of Commerce, said on behalf of the Coalition for Safe Reopening, she called on county leaders to consider three things:

- A reopening task force to identifying long-term solutions to avoid opening and closing.
- Empower local authorities to make decisions for themselves.
- Create a business interruption fund to cover expenses as the current system is not working.

“Businesses and their employees are frightened,” Morrill said. “We hear their voices and tremors as they talk about their livelihoods.”

For the roughly 20% of restaurants estimated as not being in full compliance with the county’s health orders, Morrill said to punish those restaurants but not the entire industry.

“It is cruel what’s occurred,” she said. “We are giving them no support, no recourse. The system is broken, EDD (unemployment insurance) is not acceptable and our county and state government has abandoned us. You are arbitrarily making decisions affecting people’s lives. While we mourn the lives lost we can’t forget the living who are literally struggling to survive.”

This is the 17th year that the Foundation has awarded one Offensive and Defensive Player of the Week. Recipients are selected from a group of national media members and administered by the Foundation.

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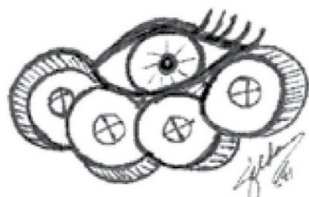

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Del Amo Fashion Center, in Torrance, will still have Santa this year, but with coronavirus protections

At least there’s one holiday tradition the coronavirus won’t nix — though it will change things.

The Del Amo Fashion Center, in Torrance, will still welcome Santa Claus this year but will implement various health measures, such as having him meet children outside, to help prevent the spread of the coronavirus.

Each year, malls around the country set up North Pole village, typically indoors, where children can sit on Santa’s lap, take a picture with him and hand Father Christmas a list of presents they’d like. But because of the coronavirus pandemic and ongoing health orders that requires malls to close indoor common areas, such as food courts, that can’t happen this year — just one of multiple holiday traditions that have been canceled this year.

But the Del Amo Fashion Center, one of the largest and most popular malls in all of Southern California, found a way to still have St. Nick visit, with the help of Cherry Hill Programs, the company that runs the Santa Photo Experience, which is set to run from Friday, Nov. 27, to Dec. 24.

“This year guests will notice a number of changes throughout their in-person visit with Santa,” according to Cherry Hill Programs, “all designed to support the health and well-being of guests, staff and Santa.”

For starters, Santa and his elves will set up shop outdoors, according to a spokesperson representing the Torrance mall.

Holding events in the open air, health officials have long said, is less risky than holding them indoors. The one bummer for kids, however, is that visiting Santa will not be a



“contact experience,” according to Cherry Hill — meaning no sitting on his lap.

But they will be able to take photos with him, though they must maintain social distance. Santa and his staff will also wear masks, a requirement guests must follow as well.

“During the visit, children will absolutely be able to have a magical visit with Santa to share smiles and their wish list,” Cherry Hill said, “while maintaining social distance and everyone will be wearing masks.”

Those who wish to let their children meet Santa should also schedule an appointment, to keep lines down and gathering at a minimum. Cherry Hill also said it encourages folks to use contactless payment.

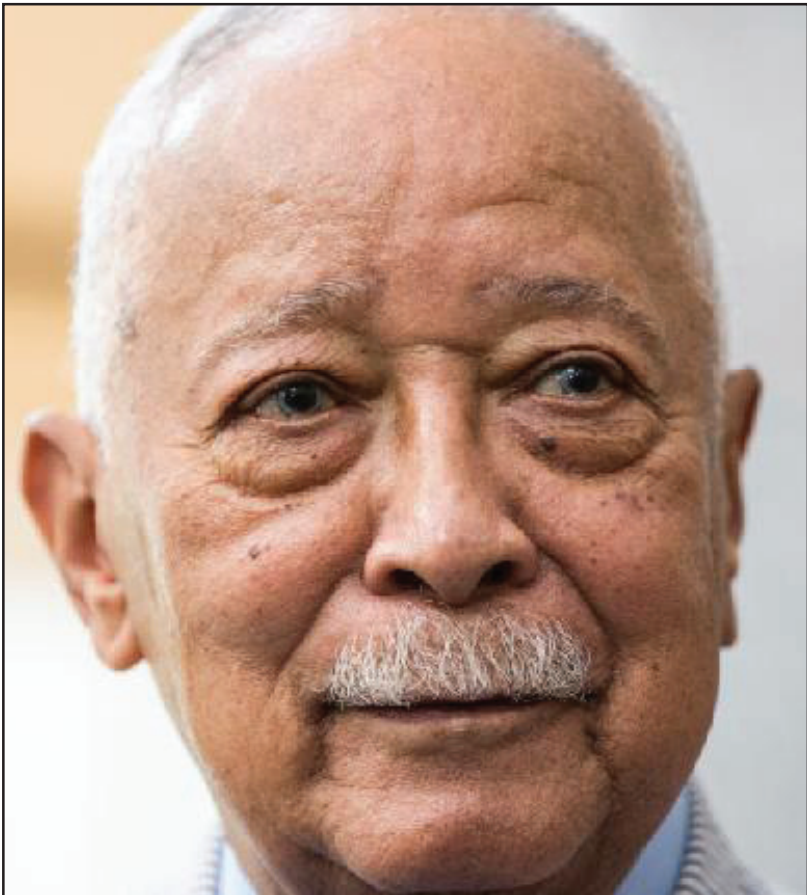
Santa and his staff, meanwhile, will daily health screenings and temperature checks, Cherry Hill said. The company will also regularly clean and sanitize the set.

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David Dinkins, NYC’s First Black Mayor, Dies at 93



Unfortunately we have to report the death of David Dinkins, who was elected New York City’s first black mayor in 1989. His passing came Monday night at his home, reports The NY Post.

Dinkins was 93 years old. Dinkins took office in 1989 after defeating three-term incumbent Ed Koch in the Democratic primary as well as Republican Rudy Giuliani to become the city’s 106th mayor.

He would serve one-term until 1993, when he narrowly lost his re-election

bid in a re-match against Giuliani. His turbulent time in office was marked by rampant crime and racial unrest. But despite the turmoil, he led the city with a grace and dignity that was respected even by his political foes and left him an admired figure when his tenure was long over.

“David was a historic mayor. He showed that a black candidate can win biracial support in a city-wide race,” said former Gov. David Paterson, who became the first African-American governor.



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Kevin Rooney’s first year off the sidelines has been as strange as all of ours



There is never enough time, until there is too much. Kevin Rooney did not plan to retire when he did. For 40 years he coached Notre Dame High in Sherman Oaks, and he won four Southern Section titles.

His players were asked to make good grades, play hard, behave themselves and speak with a civil tongue. Rooney’s strongest epithet was “God bless America!”

“People would ask me about retirement,” Rooney said. “I’d say, ‘What would I do that for? I don’t hunt, fish or play golf.’”

“I was enjoying what I was doing. We had a family atmosphere, and great support from the administration.”

On the good Thanksgiving Days, the Knights would practice on Thursday morning, get fed by a committee of parents, and then go home for the big feast. “That meant we were still playing,” Rooney said. Busier was better.

After the 2019 season Rooney stepped aside. He had been the athletic director, too. He decided to turn over the whistle to Joe McNab, his offensive coordinator and a relative short-timer at Notre Dame, since he’d only been there 39 years.

He did not worry about filling the available hours. There would be football for Notre Dame every Friday night in the fall,

right? All weekend he would sit with a notepad, and when he saw an interesting play he would draw it up, banking it for some unknown third-and-long.

Then came 2020, distorter of time.

“Mostly I’m just trying to find a game,” Rooney said, laughing. The Knights are scheduled to start playing in early 2021. Rooney said that is when he’ll know if he misses coaching. Right now he’s like the rest of us, trying to distinguish the weeks from the months.

“At first I went skiing,” Rooney said. “I hadn’t done that in 20 years, but I went to Utah and Idaho. Now I can’t really do that because of the pandemic. I work on projects around the house, but the real joy is seeing the two grandchildren. I do that every other day. They’re only a few miles away.”

They’re all coming over on Thursday, the three daughters and the kids. Brynn and her husband Greg will bring Cade, 4, and Tate, 2, and Kaitlin and Kara will be there, too. It will also be the second Thanksgiving without Maureen.

Rooney met her at Santa Clara, where he caught passes from future NFL quarterback Dan Pastorini. They married 40 years ago.

In March of 2018 Maureen was stricken by leukemia. On Oct.

30 she passed away. Rooney missed three games. He was there in 2019, but somewhere he lost the whatever-it-is that propels us all forward. He stepped down after the 6-5 season.

It should be noted that Notre Dame led Rancho Verde 38-28 in the 2018 semifinals, with 1:09 to go. A long touchdown pass, an onside kick recovery and another long touchdown pass beat the Knights, 41-38. That was Rooney’s final playoff game.

“I thought we were going to be pretty good last year but a lot of things happened that were tough to deal with,” Rooney said. “The year before, that was a rough way to lose. I didn’t think I was giving my best to the team. I didn’t have the fire to do all the work, which was a lot.”

Throughout the 2018 season Rooney would drive to the UCLA Medical Center in the morning. In the afternoons he would go back to practice. There were more than a few phone calls during practice itself, and there were times when Rooney told Maureen he couldn’t handle going to the games, and she insisted that he find a way.

“When I could get away from the hospital and be with the players, I was all right,” Rooney said. “But I left my heart with her.”

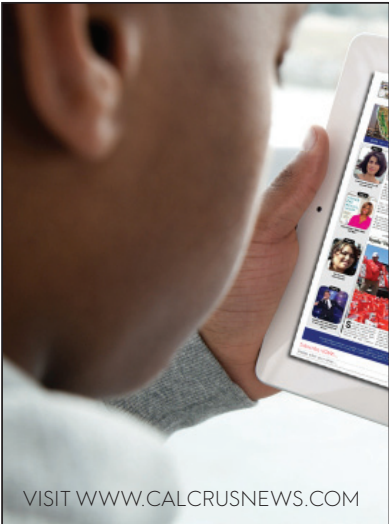
